We reflect with gratitude on the myriad projects and activities that have defined our mission and impact. Over the past year, our organization has been steadfast in its commitment to transformative initiatives, reaching diverse communities and responding to critical needs. This finance report encapsulates the financial journey of our NGO, showcasing the prudent allocation of resources to various projects aimed at fostering positive change.

Among our flagship endeavors, the establishment of a comprehensive medical center stands out prominently. Comprising four distinct clinics – general physician, dentist, gynecologist, and speech therapy – the center not only provides essential healthcare services but also conducts a yearlong training program for girls, culminating in their graduation as medical assistants.

In the realm of education, our commitment to empowering the youth has materialized through a robust program that offered a full year of education to 74 boys and girls. This initiative, inclusive of daily meals and comprehensive study materials, was supplemented by extracurricular activities including computer classes, art sessions, and music classes.


The vocational training arm of our organization has equipped over 90 students with valuable skills in carpentry, barber salon management, sewing, and cosmetics. These skills empower individuals to carve out sustainable livelihoods and contribute meaningfully to their communities. "And whatever we do, in word or deed, we do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

Our commitment to holistic well-being is evident in the trauma camps and conferences conducted for both girls and boys, benefiting 67 participants. Additionally, our transformation groups have provided unwavering support to approximately 140 women and girls, fostering a 24/7 support network for personal and collective growth.

Responding to immediate crises, our organization played a pivotal role in aiding families affected by this year's earthquake. We provided essential supplies, including food, clothes, blankets, and addressed the disruption in education by establishing three fully equipped classrooms with dedicated teachers for students who lost their academic year.

In the face of Lebanon's ongoing financial challenges, we have stood as a pillar of support, consistently providing food parcels to families in need, ensuring a sustained push for resilience.


This report delves into the financial intricacies of these endeavors and many more, encapsulating our commitment to creating positive, lasting change in the lives of those we serve.
